Disposition Terminology - "Our Final Resting Place"

A few things to consider about how your body is handled after death.

There are many ways to lay a body to rest. These terms explain common burial, cremation, and alternative practices, so you can better understand your choices and share your preferences.

Disposition

 The handling and "final resting place" of a deceased person's remains

Interment

General term for placing remains in their final resting place

Direct Disposition

 Burial or cremation without a viewing or service, sometimes using a simple container instead of a casket

Embalming

 The temporary preservation of a body using chemicals to slow decomposition

Ground/Earth Burial

 The body is placed in a casket and buried in a cemetery; usually embalmed

Green/Natural Burial

 An environmentally friendly burial without embalming, vault, or metal casket—allowing the body to return naturally to the earth

M Above Ground Burial (Entombment)

The body is placed in a crypt or sarcophagus within a mausoleum

Natural Organic Reduction (Human Composting)

 The process of transforming human remains into nutrient-rich soil through the controlled decomposition of a body

Sea Burial

 Burial at sea, following environmental and legal guidelines

Cremation

 Uses heat and flame to reduce the body to bone fragments, later processed into ashes (cremated remains/ cremains)

Crematory (Crematorium)

• The facility where cremation takes place

Alkaline Hydrolysis (Water Cremation)

 A water-based process that gently reduces the body to bone fragments, returned as ashes (hydrolyzed remains)

🖣 Urn

 A container designed to hold cremated or hydrolyzed remains

👯 Columbarium

A structure or wall with niches where urns are placed

Mausoleum

 A building that houses caskets or remains, either for a family or a community

Alternative Container

 A simple, usually combustible container used in place of a casket for cremation or burial

Scattering

• Releasing cremated remains into the wind or water, or by burying them in the earth

 May take place in a designated landscaped area for scattering or memorializing cremated remains

Prepaid Burial Plan

 An arrangement paid in advance to cover funeral or burial costs, potentially easing financial burden on loved ones
